EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Since the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic three years ago, universities and colleges experienced unprecedented disruption, creating uncertainty regarding the implications for higher education. College staff have been working hard to mitigate the impact of school closures by leveraging educational technology to increase engagement in active learning. Despite the challenges, the Executive Committee (Ex-Co) 2022-2023 of the Hong Kong Student Services Association (HKSSA) worked collectively to find and inspire new ways to address the urging needs to the student affairs profession.
- 2. Building upon the solid foundation of the predecessors, the Ex-Co 2022-2023 designed, organised and participated in activities that strengthen member connectedness, create professional exchange and development opportunities as well as networking with outbound student affairs associations.
- 3. The Annual Plan as approved by the Exco in the last April includes:
 - (1) Keep the momentum on professional learning
 - (2) Strengthen the connection on student services of higher educational institutions outbound
 - (3) Further development for future leaders in Student Affairs profession
 - (4) Support working groups & OTSSA
 - (5) Further enhancement of membership management & networking
- 4. Key events of the year
 - a. Organised Virtual Professional Circle on ZOOM with Macau Student Affairs Association (MSAA) : "Navigating the Challenges Charting Good Practices in Student Affairs"
 - b. Launched mentorship programme to groom younger members with potentials. Heartfelt appreciation goes to the FIVE mentors who serve in the programme
 - c. Organised Online Gathering for Institutional Representatives
 - d. Organised training activities for practitioners working in student services of higher education with the below objectives:
 - To understand the field of student affairs & the role of the profession in further promoting student learning and development
 - To provide opportunities for practitioners to continue to expand their knowledge and skills
 - To inspire practitioners to begin a lifetime journey of growth and self-exploration
 - e. Organised Annual Professional Dialogue : "Facing the Challenge of Student Services Profession in Higher Education: Mission, Positioning and Future Talents Cultivation" with the support from MSAA.

- f. Supported the Hong Kong Outstanding Tertiary Students' Services Association (OTSSA) for the execution of Outstanding Tertiary Students' Services Award.
- g. Supported initiatives of the three Working Groups.
- 5. These initiatives attracted a good number of participants and received encouraging feedback. Coupled with the collective efforts of the Ex-Co members and institutional representatives in promoting the work of the HKSSA, the number of full members maintained at 159 as of the end of February 2023.
- 6. Both the Facebook page and website of the HKSSA had been regularly updated for brand building and engagement of SA practitioners.

- 8. Four Ex-Co meetings were held on 08 April, 07 July, 06 October 2022, and 12 January 2023. The AGM was scheduled to be held on 24 March 2023.
- 9. The Ex-Co supported the initiatives of its working groups, namely the Hong Kong Tertiary Institutions Health Care Working Group (HCWG), The Hong Kong Tertiary Institutions Psychological Counselling Working Group (HKTIPCWG) and Working Group on Career Services (WGCS), and the Hong Kong Outstanding Tertiary Students' Services Association (OTSSA) in advancing the professional development of SA practitioners and student leaders.
- 10. The Ex-Co had invited Mr Simon CHAN to continue serving as the Honorary Auditor of the HKSSA for 2022-2023. Heartfelt appreciation goes to Mr. Chan for his very kind support to HKSSA.

ANNUAL PLAN

- 11. The Exco approved the Annual Plan in last April and the Secretariat, including the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and the Under Secretary (Ms Peggy MANG/ TWC) coordinate the execution of the plan with the strong support from all Exco members.
- 12. A brief elaboration of the key elements is shown from point 13 to 17 below.

VIRTUAL PROFESSIONAL CIRCLE

NAVIGATING THE CHALLENGES - CHARTING GOOD PRACTICES

IN STUDENT AFFAIRS

18. The event was conducted on ZOOM on 17 Jun 2022.

19. Six discussion groups:

- Optimizing in-person and virtual student engagement
- Building diverse communities and inclusive campuses
- Promoting Wellness
- Enriching support for student with special education needs
- Engaging student bodies
- Crises Management

- 20. 105 participants out of 114 registrations have attended the VPC. We have arranged 17 participants in average per group, seven participants in the smallest group and 22 participants in the biggest group.
- 21. A post-event report in **APPENDIX A** is attached for members' reference.

MENTORSHIP PROGRAMME

- 22. The Scheme, first launched in 2016-2017, had been organised to create opportunities for young and enthusiastic practitioners to learn commitment to student development works and widen scope of knowledge from seasoned student affairs leaders.
- 23. This year, five current student affairs directors or senior staff were invited to serve as mentors for 11 mentees from 6 institutions, in small groups of 2 to 3 from June 2022 to March 2023.
- 24. The five mentors are:
 - Ms Sandy LAI, Assistant Director of Student Affairs, HKEdU
 - Mr Simon LAU, Head of Student Affairs, Tung Wah College
 - Dr Tommy LAW, Career & Employability Consultant, CityU
 - Ir Dr Joseph SO, Head of Student Affairs Office, CPCE PolyU
 - Ms Connie WONG, Assistant Director of Student Affairs, LU
- 25. In light of the social distancing restriction, a virtual kick-off meeting was organised on 29 June 2022 to promote connection between mentors and mentees, align expectation on the Mentorship Scheme as well as facilitate preliminarily planning of meeting schedule and possible activities. Participants are required to submit a learning journal by mid-March 2023. Final reports will be submitted after the programme ended in April 2023.

TRAINING ACTIVITIES

- 26. The 1st training workshop was conducted on 28 Oct 2022 with face-to face at CityU.
- 27. With a quota of 30 and turned out 34 attendees.
- 28. We had the honour to invite Mr. Raymond LEUNG, former Chairperson of HKSSA to share the topic "Rethinking Student Affairs and Implications for Student Affairs Professionals".

- 30. The 2nd training workshop was conducted on 3 Feb 2023 with face-to-face at HKU.
- 31. We had the honour to invite Dr Tom FONG, former Chairperson of HKSSA to share the topic "Handling Student Crisis and Emergencies in Student Affairs".
- 32. Over 80 colleagues were attended.
- 33. Final reports will be submitted after the programme ended in April 2023.

HKSSA ANNUAL PROFESSIONAL DIALOGUE

- 34. The event was conducted on 24 March 2023 in PolyU main campus in hybrid mode with also arrangement of ZOOM.
- 35. In the past few years, it has been a challenging topic about talent acquisition and cultivation in student affairs. Through the dialogue session we showed different aspects in student affairs: What are the challenges we are facing? What is our positioning? What could we help for future talents cultivation?
- 36. The topic was "Facing the Challenge of Student Services Profession in Higher Education: Mission, Positioning and Future Cultivation."
- 37. In this dialogue session, we are very honored to have 1) Prof. Samson TSE, Dean of Student Affairs from HKU; 2) Prof. KO Wing-hung, University Dean of Students from CUHK to be our guest speakers with also the sharing from Mr Simon LAU, Chairperson of HKSSA and Head of Student Affairs in TWC. Dr Joseph SO, the Immediate Past Chairperson of HKSSA and Head of Student Affairs in CPCE PolyU took the role as Facilitator throughout the dialogue session.
- 38. Colleagues from MSAA joined the event via ZOOM.

STRENGTHENING THE COLLABORATION WITH WORKING GROUPS AND OTSSA

- 39. An online talk 中醫穴療助好眠 on 12 December 2022 for university staff and students was conducted. Ms. Hung Hing Yu Ada, Assistant Lecturer of School of Chinese Medicine of CUHK was invited as the guest speaker. HKSSA Secretariat supported the promotion and turned out a very positive response with 161 participants attended.
- 40. Mr Simon LAU, the Chairperson and Dr Joseph SO, the Immediate Past Chairperson were invited to be two of the judges of the final interview for the Outstanding Services Awards for Tertiary Students 2021-2022 as organised by the Hong Kong Outstanding Tertiary Students' Service Association (HKOTSSA) on 11 Jun 2022. The award was introduced in 1991 to recognise tertiary students with outstanding leadership and significant contribution to the community.
- 41. The Chairperson was invited to give a speech and present awards to the 20 recipients at the HKOTSSA Outstanding Service Awards for Tertiary Students Ceremony 2021-2022 on 5 November 2022. HKSSA also supported the promotion of 2022-2023 award application to member institutions in March 2022.

BROADCASTING OF RESOURCEFUL INFORMATION

42. To enrich the professional knowledge and skills of members for enhancing the quality and diversity of student development programmes and student affairs services, members have been feeding with various news and updates on student development and staff development programmes.

COMMUNICATION AND MEMBERSHIP

43. The Association continued to appoint a total of 20 members as Institutional Representatives to facilitate communication and liaison among local institutions. The following colleagues served in this capacity and their efforts were greatly appreciated.

- 44. An Online Gathering for Institutional Representatives was conducted on 18 May 2022. We defined the roles of an Institutional Representative:
 - (1) Bridging the communication gap between SA colleagues and the EXCO of HKSSA
 - (2) Help promote HKSSA activities to SA colleagues.
 - (3) Motivate colleagues at the institution to attend HKSSA activities.

In short, the core duty includes Communication, Promotion and Motivation.

- 45. HKSSA continued to promote activities through Facebook, official homepage, and mass emails to reach out to and engage members. The number of followers on Facebook had been growing steadily with 481 subscribers as of early March 2023.
- 46. The HKSSA website was Maintained with the kind assistance from Ms Adele WAN and Ms Clare LEUNG who had been providing support in the updating and maintenance of the website of the association. It will continue to serve as a platform for members to interflow and share good practices in student affairs.






1. Which breakout room with the following discussion themes did you participate in? ⁵⁹ responses




















